gentlemen:

Enclosed please find the application to utilize an alternate fuel in the cement kiln owned and operated by the Southwestern Portland Cement Company in Bath Township, Greene County, Ohio. Also, enclosed are two appendix E schedules for the additional storage tanks required to hold the alternate fuel, comprised of organic spent solvents.

In the meeting of December 15, 1981, with you, Mr. Dennis Shay representatives of Solvent Resource Recovery, Inc. and Mr. Glen McClernon of Southwestern Portland Cement Company, concern was expressed regarding the requirement of a PTI for this alternate fuel program

It is our firm belief that in using the waste organic solvents (alternate fuel) in Southwestern Portland Cement Company's cement kiln, no additional air pollutants are being admitted to the atmosphere. In fact, since coal is currently used as the heat source, our proposed fuel will actually decrease the present levels of SO₂ and particulate matter. This is the case since the sulfur content of the alternate fuel will be between 0 and 1%. Also, the particulate matter will be much less since coal has an average ash content of around 15%, while the alternate fuel ash content will be maintained at less than 8%.

The inauguration of the alternate fuel program at Southwestern Portland Cement Company benefits both the generator of this industrial waste as well as the cement company. The generator has an approved outlet for the disposal of his spent material, while the cement company can benefit by virtue of reducing his fuel cost. This cost reduction will assist materially in maintaining an economically viable position on the part of a major employer in the Fairborn, Ohio area.

We would like to point out that it is not the intent of Solvent Resource Recovery nor Southwestern Portland Cement Company to use the alternate fuel program as a disposal site for hazardous wastes but as a **valid thermal recovery program**

Both Solvent Resource Recovery, Inc., the supplier of alternate fuels, and Southwestern Portland Cement Company, the user, believe the above mentioned reasons are sufficient to exempt Southwestern Portland Cement Company from going through the formal PTI siting program.

We appreciate your assistance in this project and look forward to your favorable response in the immediate future.


